## Determining a World Champion- Contingency Plan - NSCA / CPSA/ M\&M

1) If the main event of the World Sporting Clays Championship is shortened due to the occurrence of any natural disaster, act of God or event beyond the direct, immediate control of M\&M Sporting Clays and National Sporting Clays Association the following procedure will be used to establish the World Sporting champion, runner up, and third place.
2) The total score shot from all competitors plus the addition of 66 or 67 (whichever course you have not shot) targets for the remaining course not shot will be the raw score to determine the shoot off for champion, runner-up, and third place for the World Sporting Clays Championship. The top 6 scores and all ties will move into the shoot-off field to attempt a 25 -target shoot-off. Competitors will shoot 25 targets until all ties have been broken to establish the Champion, Runner Up, and third as well as $4^{\text {th }}, 5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$ overall. Winners will determine solely on the score 25 target shoot-off.
3) First, second and third and all ties in all class and concurrent will be determined by a 10 target shoot off in the corresponding field to determine concurrent champion, runner-up and third. Winners will determine solely on the score of the 10 target shoot-off.
4) A world champion will not be named unless all competitors have had the opportunity to shoot at least 133 targets. In the event all competitors have not attempted a minimum of 133 targets only course champions will be awarded, and prize money distributed evenly between the three courses.
5) Shooters who have completed all three courses will receive a perfect score of 67 on the SL2 course to even the playing field.
6) The shoot-off for champion, runner-up and third place will be held, weather permitting, on Sunday of the World Sporting Clays Championship in the Shoot-off arena at approximately 6:15 p.m. EST.
7) The shoot-off for first, second and third place in all class and concurrent will be held, weather permitting, on Sunday of the World Sporting Clays Championship at approximately 6:15 p.m. EST at a site to be announced.
8) If these above-mentioned shoot-offs cannot be held on Sunday evening prior to 10:00 p.m. EST due to the occurrence of any natural disaster, act of God or event beyond the direct, immediate control of M\&M and National Sporting Clays Association then the World Championship title will not be awarded. Class money will be awarded based on ties breaker stations.
9) Any shooter who is not present 10 (ten) minutes before the shoot-off shall forfeit his or her position. The position will not be filled by any alternates.
10) The shoot-off rotation will be determined by a lottery draw completed inside registration.
11) The open, concurrent and class World Sporting Champion will be the individual with the highest score in the shoot-off.
12) All other placements will be decided by total score of targets attempted plus addition of 66 or 67 targets.
13) The CPSA, NSCA and M\&M Sporting Clays will together decide on any clarification to the above contingency plan as needed.

## Side Events

If the side events of the World Sporting Clays Championship are shortened due to the occurrence of any natural disaster, act of God or event beyond the direct, immediate control of M\&M Sporting Clays
and National Sporting Clays Association the following procedure will be used to establish the open champion, as well as Class and Concurrent champions from shooters who have completed the events.

1) All awards will be based on scores of competitors who complete the event. If no shooters complete the event, no awards or punches will be provided.
2) Shoot-offs will be event specific and listed in the program book.
